# Description of Course Content

Since the publication of David Bakan's book, *Sigmund Freud and the Jewish Mystical Tradition*, in 1958, there has been a burgeoning literature regarding Freud's Jewish identity, and the degree to which Judaism in general, and Jewish mysticism in particular, contributed to the creation and development of psychoanalysis.

In this presentation, we will discuss Freud's conflicted and ambivalent relationship with Judaism and Jewish thought. We will examine areas of convergence between psychoanalysis and our understanding of the human psyche or soul, and their implications for psychotherapeutic and psychoanalytic practice.

# Learning Goals and Objectives

Participants will be able to:

1. To understand the role of Judaism, Jewish thought, and Jewish mysticism in Freud's life and work.
2. To understand basic kabbalistic concepts and to consider how they may enrich and inform psychotherapeutic and psychoanalytic practice.
3. To examine the role of religious thought and belief in the practice of psychotherapy and psychoanalysis.
