Norka T. Malberg, PsyD., is a certified child and adolescent psychoanalyst and adult psychoanalyst. She is Assistant Clinical Professor at the Yale Child Study Center, School of Medicine. She is a Member of the Western New England Psychoanalytic Society and the Contemporary Freudian Society. She obtained her doctorate at University College London for her work on development of mentalization based group intervention with Chronically Ill Adolescents. She lectures and publishes widely in the US, Latin America and Europe on the topics of attachment, trauma, chronic illness and child and adult diagnosis. She is the co-editor of the child and adolescent sections of the PDM2 (Psychodynamic Diagnostic Manual). Her most recent books are: *Mentalization Based Therapy with Children* and *Working with Emotions in Psychotherapy* which she co-authored with Leslie Greenberg and Michael Tompkins.

Description of Course Content

The last twenty years have seen the inception of an integration of attachment theory to the clinical repertoire of most clinicians. Attachment research and theory have become a place for clinical integration under the aegis of developmental psychoanalysis. This three-hour-workshop will introduce the participant to the theory and application of Mentalization Based Treatment (MBT). The focus of the presentation will be mainly the work with adults presenting with Borderline Organization. Clinical examples will be used to illustrate the applications of theoretical concepts such as : marked mirroring and epistemic trust.
