Introduction

The Oklahoma Society for Psychoanalytic Studies (OSPS) is presenting a course in Foundations of Psychoanalytic Thought. This course will occur on a weekly basis, Fridays from 1:00pm to 4:00pm for a total of 35 weeks throughout the academic year of 2017-2018, August through May. The classes will be held in conference rooms at the State Board of Regents of Higher Education, 655 Research Parkway, Oklahoma City, and will be limited to 12 participants. Following the two introductory sessions, each week's time will be divided equally between didactic presentation and conference or case material. The course work will be divided into four sections. The first section, Introduction to Psychoanalytic Models, will take place over the first two weeks and will provide an overview of three psychoanalytic models. The other three sections will include the Conflict Model (11 weeks), the Object Relations Model (12 weeks), and the Relational Model (10 weeks). Students will be invited to present cases to be discussed from the psychoanalytic models. The Case Conference faculty orientation will roughly correspond to the section being presented. Psychologists, social workers, licensed professional counselors, licensed marriage and family therapists, and licensed alcohol and drug counselors may receive up to 105 continuing education hours (3 CEUs for each lecture they attend) for completion of this course.
